Technically, no state outlaws or bans solar panels; quite the opposite. Most states have solar access laws that forbid any agreement, covenant, condition, bylaw, or contract that outlaws or limits solar installations by Homeowners Associations (HOA) or other municipal bodies. TDLR regulates the sale or lease of solar energy systems intended or designed primarily for family, personal, or household use to collect and use solar energy to generate electricity, as well as their installation by electrical contractors. Do not hire an unlicensed solar installer or unlicensed. Most states allow homeowners to install solar panels themselves, provided they obtain proper permits, follow local building codes, and pass required inspections. However, any electrical connections to the power grid must typically be completed by a licensed electrician.

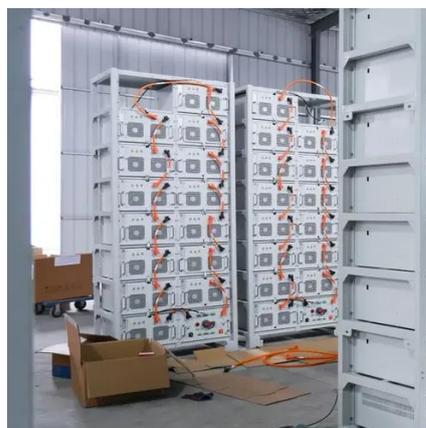
